

Oak's Summer Newsletter



English

To begin with, we will be reading and performing the poem 'The Highway Man', we will then move on to looking at alternative fairy tales which will lead on to us looking at play scripts linked to our end of year production. We will also look at some of the plays written by William Shakespeare. In drama, we will also be rehearsing for the production.

Maths

In maths, to begin with, we will be looking at area and volume. We will then move on to focusing on shape work and angles which will lead on to rotation and translation. Oak will also be working on coordinates and plotting across four quadrants.

Science

Year 5 will be learning about forces. The children will be studying pulleys and levers and how they can use these to create different models that move.

Year 6 will be finishing off their work on evolution and Darwin's voyage around the world developing his theory of it. They will then be studying the eye and light; focusing on how we see things and how light travels.

Computing

In computing, the children will be programming the WeDo Lego models, designing their own model and writing instructions to go with them for others to use.

Art/DT

In art, we will be studying different artists through the ages and looking at how their styles vary. The children will then be creating their own artwork imitating their style.

RE

Oak will be focusing on the topic of 'Words of Wisdom' and exploring who and what can be a source of guidance in their lives. They will be looking at significant texts and how they can have effects on others.

PE

Oak class will have PE on a Monday and Tuesday afternoon for this half term. The children will be having Topscore UK on a Tuesday. On a Monday we will be doing rounders/athletics.

Music

We will be practising songs for the end of year play!

Reminders

Oak children will be given homework on a Friday and are expected to bring it in for the date given to them. Reading books may be changed on a Tuesday and a Friday but the children can always take extra books from the library if they wish to.
