Behaviour in school

As you will be aware, our most recent Ofsted inspection in June 2015 rated the behaviour of children in our school as 'Outstanding'. I am sure that as parents you feel very proud of this accolade, and I would like to thank you for your continued support in helping us to maintain our high standards in this area.

The children are very clear about the ethos that underpins our Behaviour Policy, and understand that unacceptable behaviour will always result in a consequence. Although we stress the value of forgiveness, we **do not** promote the idea that 'it is alright to be mean to someone as long as you say sorry'. There are a range of sanctions that are used in school which the children consider to be fair. In a recent survey of representative groups of children across all year groups, Mrs Sandbrook reported the following:

The children said they felt safe in our school. The children unanimously felt that if anyone did misbehave there were ways to help prevent this and fair sanctions were in place such as peer mediation, the 'Stop It' policy, time out to cool off and strike marks on the board. They said that if there was a problem they could discuss it with adults including teachers, teaching assistants, dinner supervisors and staff from Top Score and they felt that they were listened to. Children mentioned that 'Mrs Bostock's door was always open' to them.

The children thought that other adults' perception of their behaviour was very good as often people would phone school to say how well children had behaved when on school visits. The school was a friendly welcoming place, and they felt that their behaviour contributed to this as visitors see them as being very polite. The children said that they always greeted visitors, opened doors for them and spoke to them around school.
